I was thrilled to be drafted to Port Adelaide. I had been a club member since birth and have supported the club my whole life – it couldn't have worked out any better for me and I'm really thankful.

My family was really pleased for me. The Jackson side were obviously already massive Port Adelaide fans, so they were all thrilled. The Tiller side are all Crows fans, but they were still stoked for me. Mum got Gran and Gramps their first Port Adelaide membership for Christmas, so they're slowly coming around.

My football hero is Robbie Gray from Port Adelaide – I always liked him as a player prior to being drafted and now I've become mates with him I have even more respect.

Throughout my football career I have been fortunate to play with several old scholars. Leo Coates and I played together at St Mark's, Crystal Brook and North Adelaide, Kallis Freer and Jamison Murphy also played at North Adelaide with us.
