We have turned another page in the history of St Mark's College. Next year marks the Golden Jubilee of the amalgamation of schools into St Mark's College and we look forward to marking this significant occasion with a commemorative Mass.

This year we have seen remarkable achievements across all areas of school life. Our Awards assemblies at the end of Semester 1 and Semester 2 demonstrated strength of academic learning, but there has been so much more to celebrate this year.

Polding had a clean sweep with Sports Day success at Benedict and ended a twenty-year drought at Bosco! St Mark's was able to retain the Fr Dennis Handley Cup against Xavier College and in SAPSASA our boys won the State Championships. We are proud of Year 11 student Lucas Guilin, not only for being a Young Australian of the Year this year, but also for representing Australia in the U17 men's netball recently in Auckland.

Our Agriculture Program remains strong with prizes at the Adelaide Show. At the Copper Coast Show we achieved first place in the Grand Parade, and Alex O'Neil won first place in the steer handler competition and second place in the Cattle Young Judge Competition.

In other areas of curriculum, Amahli Nielson won the Walparra Anpa Award, and Lili Bowman will be experiencing the trip of a lifetime to Vietnam next year as a winner of the Premier's ANZAC School Prize.

Social Justice action is always high on our agenda, and our Year 11 students raised almost \$20,000 in the Vinnies Sleepout. Project Compassion raised over \$5000, and for the first year, our

primary students participated in the Day for Daniel Walkathon, raising a fantastic \$12,000 and winning a trampoline in the process for being the school that raised the most funds for this important cause. Megan Congdon has led the school in implementing initiatives focusing on ecological sustainability and we will build on this next year.

Each year we say farewell to staff as they retire or take on new challenges and this year was no exception. It is always sad when long-serving staff who have shown tremendous loyalty and given incredible service to a community move on. I extend heartfelt thanks and recognition to Mr Mark Murphy, Ms Melissa Gadaleta and Mrs Angela Jordan who are retiring, and also to Mr John Gibson and Mrs Jane Gibson who are moving to Port Lincoln and taking up position at my previous school, St Joseph's. Between them, these wonderful members of our community have dedicated over 150 years to the care and education of students at St Mark's and they will be greatly missed, although hopefully we will see Mark, Angela and Melissa back for some relief teaching in the future.

In closing, I thank all old scholars for staying connected with us and for attending the Reunion this year. There are always opportunities for you to visit and share your expertise about life and careers with students, so if you would like to be active in your support of St Mark's College, please let us know.

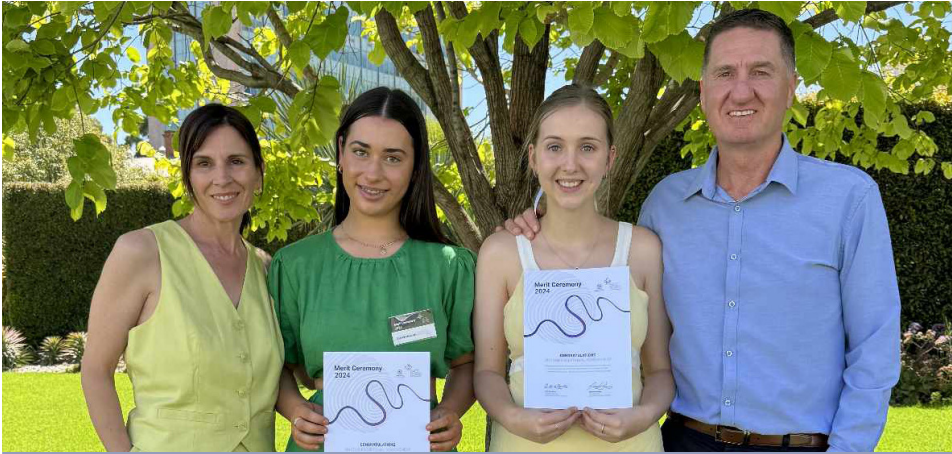


ATHLETICS DAY: After 20 long years, the drought was broken and Polding took the win at Bosco Athletics Day.

BROOKE NORTH,

Space. Exploration. Minerals. Not words you find in your usual every day career! Brooke North from our Class of 2015 is head-deep in a career in geology, working with Fleet Space Technologies, a company building space-enabled technology to solve global challenges and empower humanity's exploration of new worlds.

I was dead set on becoming a geologist ever since I was about thirteen years old. I was always fascinated with rocks, collecting them and bringing them home, and my Dad suggested that it could become a career. I remember picking my degree out in a SACE book in Year 10, completing work experience at the Nyrstar Smelter in Metallurgy, and focussing my Year 12 Research Project on a career in Geoscience.

I grew up in Warnertown with my beautiful Mum and Dad, Anthony and Andrea, and older sister, Ebony(2010). I also have three older siblings who went to St Mark's too - Elouise (1995), Luke (1998) and Kate (1999). Mum and Dad are both Life Coaches so I feel incredibly lucky to have been exposed to their learnings growing up.

I had a lot of awesome teachers during school, but I have to give a special mention to Mr Andrew Sheridan. He was really supportive of me, especially during Year 12. He guided me with my Research Project, even linking me up with a geologist he knew personally for an interview! I also have a special place in my heart for my Year 3 Teacher Miss Karen Screen!

Some of my greatest memories from school included playing and coaching

hockey for St Mark's and St Andrew's. It was an awesome community to be a part of and I really enjoyed competing in carnivals in other country towns too.

I moved straight to Adelaide after finishing school to start my Bachelors Degree. The transition from home to city life was tough, but I was committed to my studies... and I baked a lot of biscuits which reminded me of home!

Fast-forward to today and my official title at Fleet is 'Mineral Exploration Account Specialist'. Each day is different, but usually my days involve analysing our 3D subsurface models and pulling out geologically interesting features to show clients. I do a lot of research and make presentations, write reports and technical papers to showcase my findings, and join various meetings with different teams in our company.

I love the fact that I feel like I am making a difference. Being one of only a few geoscientists working at Fleet and having experience in copper exploration (for green energy transition) I feel like I am at the forefront of change in our state, country, and the world.

A career highlight was working with OZ Minerals for a multi-collaborative research project involving universities, mining and exploration companies, and government bodies all over Australia and some overseas! It involved lots of travel to meet with stakeholders which was an awesome experience.

Although it took a few years to warm up to Adelaide, I absolutely love living here now. I have a very active friend group so we are always going on trips together and spending too much money on food!

I often grab a coffee with school friends



in Adelaide which is always lovely. Every time I go home to visit Mum and Dad, I make sure to catch up with my two closest friends from school – Kireea Cugley and Yasmin Bishop.

TOM PORTA, **Class of 2010**

In today's classroom teachers work with a number of students with a range of needs. Dr Tom Porta from our Class of 2010 is based at the University of Adelaide and has devoted his career to bridging the gap of inclusivity in schools.

I loved my schooling experience at St Mark's, so it was a natural choice for me to want become a teacher. After I finished school in 2010, I moved to Adelaide and started my studies at Flinders University.

I finished my degree in 2014 and began my teaching career. I worked in a range of schools across different education systems. During this time, I became fascinated by the school experience for people with a disability. Growing up with a cousin who has a disability, I was quite aware of the challenges he faced on a daily basis. So in 2019 I started my Masters of Education with a focus on Special Education.

Crossing that stage in Toowomba, graduating from my Master's with my parents in the crowd to cheer me on was an absolute highlight.

At the completion of my masters, and with the change from 'Mr Porta' to 'Dr Porta' my career moved into the academic world and I became a lecturer, teaching future teachers how to be teachers.

It is vastly different working at a university. At school you really are 'on the ground' watching the students progress (which I love and miss) where university is more philosophical. I am now the Program Director of the Master's of Education at the University of Adelaide. While I miss standing at the front of a classroom, I get

to do a lot of research and work towards bridging the gap in inclusion.

This year, my first book 'The Dance of Differentiation' was published. I like to think of it as a candid book and a critical friend for teachers. I am often asked about the book's unique title. Teaching is an art form which takes practice. Like dancing. It takes time. You won't be great at the beginning.

The book, based on my research, is a practical guide for teachers and a starting point for school's looking to make change. As a teacher, you aren't ever going to meet every students needs in every lesson of every day. But there are little things we can do that will make a difference.

When I think back to my school days, I fondly remember my group of friends. We still catch up from time to time for significant events and it's like we were only together yesterday. Many of my extended family members work at the College today, and my nephew Luca attends Mini Mark's Playgroup.

One of my favourite memories from school is preparing for Sports Day in Year 12. Anyone who remembers me from school knows that sport and I were not the best of friends (and wouldn't believe that I actually worked as a personal trainer while at uni!). So in an effort to avoid Sports Day all together, I lied and said I would be interstate. Mrs Kate Lavis was onto me from the get-go. No sooner had she called my Mum and confirmed that I was in fact available to compete in Sports Day. I will never forget her running up to tell me that I was signed up for every event. While I hid most of Sports Day (despite the continuous calls from Mrs Lavis over the PA 'Tom Porta to shotput, Tom Porta to high jump') I did



join in the 1500m with an enthusiastic Mrs Lavis cheering me on from the sidelines!

I attended the College for our reunion a few years ago and it's wonderful to see the developments that have happened across the years. Its great to see the school is still a place that students are taught by brilliant teachers in a supportive environment.

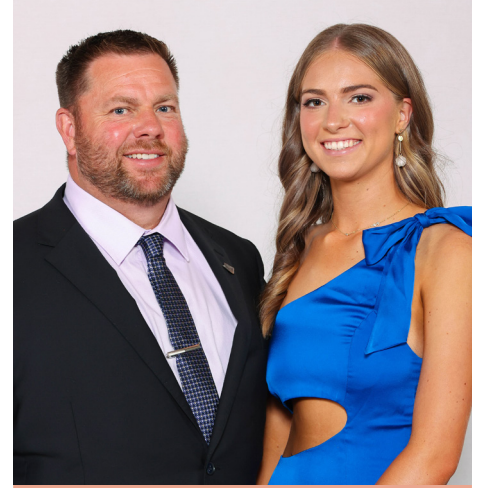

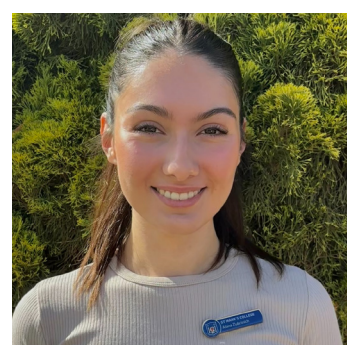

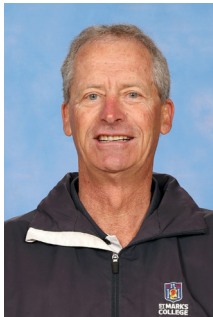
