Gratitude and Grace

I have been listening recently to 'Bright Shining: how grace changes everything' by Julia Baird. It is a book about seeking grace and dignity in our shared humanity and connection with each other, being kind when kindness is a challenge, forgiving the unforgiveable and loving the unlovable. Surely the idea of Grace is one of the most profound lessons we also learn from the Gospel. I've seen the attributes of Grace described in an acrostic poem. I don't know the author, but share it here as food for thought:

G is for generosity, the will to do something more for others.

R is for respect, the dignity of life and work.

A is for action, the mechanism of change.

C is for compassion and concern for others

E is energy, the spirit that catalyses us.

As we reach the end of Term 2, I feel immense gratitude for the moments of grace that we have experienced in our College and community so far this year. I see grace in day-to-day interactions, in the kindness and generosity of students and staff, to each other and to strangers, the commitment to social action arising from compassion and concern for others and the energy (albeit waning now in Week 10) that sustains us in our mission, nurtured by the Spirit and our faith.

Of all weeks for me to have been thinking with gratitude about grace, on Wednesday we welcomed Bruce Morecombe OAM, and Denise Morecombe OAM to our Benedict campus. Their son, Daniel, was abducted

and murdered on 7 December 2003 and they were not able to lay him to rest until nine years later. Driven by their terrible loss, Bruce and Denise established the Daniel Morecombe Foundation in memory of their son, and to actively promote awareness of child safety. What an example of grace at work. Their presentation was interesting and engaging, and their message so important. The safety and wellbeing of our children is one of the most significant responsibilities we have in our community.

Enjoy a well-earned break. Take time to rest. I hope that over the next two weeks you consciously seek out moments of grace. When we attune ourselves to searching for them, we find them in abundance.




